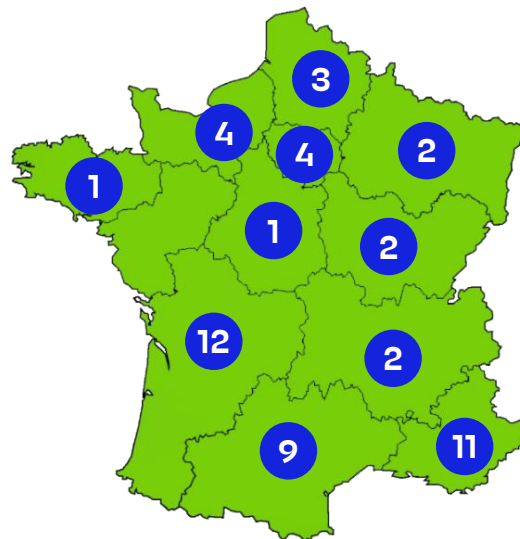


Results of the 2024 Local Flexibility tenders: Enedis holds 46 MW of potential flexibility on the electrical grid

Following its call for tenders on 13 March 2024, Enedis has chosen NW - Smart Grid Energy, Voltalis and Oaktree Power to provide 51 local flexibility services to boost the performance of the public electricity distribution grid in 30 French *départements*. In total, these services represent an unprecedented 46 MW of flexible capacity, compared with 4.5 MW from the 2023 call for tenders.

Of this 46 MW, corresponding to the electricity consumption of approximately 46,000 households, 41 MW will be supplied by NW - Smart Grid Energy (selected from 41 bids), 2.5 MW by Voltalis (selected from 5 bids) and 2.5 MW by Oaktree Power (selected from 5 bids). These three players will thus help to optimise the electricity supply in 30 *départements*, particularly in the event of work or incidents on the public electricity distribution grid.

These players must now set up their local flexibility services in the areas concerned by 16 May 2025. **Services must be operational no later than 1 June 2025.**
